The best day water depths are typically 10-12 feet. Night depths are generally much shallower. The clear water conditions in the area will make header presentations almost impossible this spring. Trolling, Casting and Bobber Long-line Rigs will be the most successful techniques this spring. The northern pike will be slightly deeper in depth than the walleyes.
